

## THE IMPORTANCE OF INTERNATIONAL TREATIES IN THE FIELD OF INTERNATIONAL POLICE COOPERATION

### ABSTRACT

The importance of international treaties in the field of international police cooperation in combating crime with global proportions would be faded, but also it would be impossible if international legal mechanisms are not meet. Seeing permanent risk through the appearance of various forms of organized crime in contemporary society, the states have made continuous efforts to achieve their objectives in preventing and combating it through bilateral and multilateral agreements. The forms of international organized crime have sparked the attention of democratic world and governments to consolidate and obtain tools in order to implement efficient instruments of cooperation. In this context, I have considered the importance of bilateral or multilateral conventions and their impact on providing of legal grounds for international cooperation between states in preventing and combating the organized crime and forms of its appearance.
