G. D. NYAMNDI'S ART AND EQUALITY IN MONO AND DUAL SEX SYSTEMS

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ABSTRACT

This paper sets out to determine the extent to which G. D. Nyamdi's art reaffirms unabused gender roles which were inherent in pre-colonial African societies. Nyamndi's literary works present a positive gendered relation society in general which is unlike that presented by most early African writers. Nzegwu's theoretical standpoints with regard to equality as viewed in the dual-sex system, where there was complementarity between the sexes unlike the monosex system that promotes hierarchical gender relations informs the analysis. The paper hinges on the fact that African literary writings have evolved from a phase where women were almost totally marginalised to one which has a more positive outlook on women and their capabilities. This evolution is actually an acknowledgement of pre-colonial gender roles that were not as hierarchical as we have them today.
