DILEMMAS OF A CONTINUING CONFLICT

ABSTRACT

It is not about Roland Emmerich's "The Day After Tomorrow" movie title, dedicated to a natural apocalypse of the world at global freezing temperatures, but to what has happened and continues with the Middle East conflict, where the temperatures are still standing at the boiling point.
